I will never leave you or forsake you.

At the end of the long story of Moses in the Old Testament, there is a twist in the narrative. It turns out that the LORD does succession planning. After generations of promises and an arduous journey out in the wilderness, Moses gets a glimpse of the Promised Land from the mountain top, but he doesn't actually lead the people into it. He sends Joshua with these words: "Be strong and courageous, for you must go with this people into the land that the LORD swore to their ancestors to give them... The LORD goes before you and will be with you; you will never be abandoned or forsaken. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged (Deuteronomy 31:7-8)." Moses led the people through many hardships but it is Joshua who crosses the Jordan with the Israelites.

In the on-going life of congregations, we don't gather and say to one another, "Well, we made 170 quilts so I guess we are done with that." Or, "Now that we brought food to the food shelves, we are done providing ministry to anyone else." We are always dealing with the questions of continuing ministry and from time to time leadership succession. Pastors, even the most beloved, move into retirement eventually, and someone else comes along to help and guide and offer comfort.

Over and over in the Bible we are told that we are not alone. We are not alone in our work and play. We are not alone in our prayer and praise. We are not alone in our suffering and our dying.

You are not alone in this between time of waiting for someone to answer Lakeside Community Lutheran's call. God, in Christ, is always with you. This is the foundation on which you can rest. You will never be forsaken.

Meanwhile, it's OK in the midst of missing one pastor to be excited about ministry and plan what might come next. You have all the promises of this life and the next; you've had a good and kind leader who couldn't be with you forever. And now, like those ancestors in faith, you cross into an entirely new adventure.

I look forward to getting to know you all better. I ask for your patience as we figure out the best ways to use my time. Your congregation council is there for you. Danny Wheeler is there for you. My colleagues from Yellow Lake Lutheran are graciously offering their help. And if you have questions or problems you can call, text or email me and if I don't have the answer I'll find someone who can help.

write Mission quilting on the memo part of your check.



ADRC MEALS ON WHEELS AT LAKESIDE

Sebrina Naglosky spoke to the council on changes in the way ADRC is handling Meals on Wheels and congregate in-person dining. They are moving from 3 kitchens to 1 in Siren. This development caused the A&H Senior Center to decide not to participate and a new dining area was needed. They will prepare the food in Siren and bring it to Lakeside in bulk to be packaged for home distribution and in-person dining. They will use our plates, silverware, etc., for those using our facility. About 7 or less attend on **Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday.** They will need the kitchen and a portion of the fellowship hall between 9:30 and 12:30 and

will clean up after themselves. Should a funeral or some other function conflict, they will make other arrangements.

Meals will be served around 11:00am on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. If you wish to make a reservation, or cancel a reservation, please call 715-349-2154, 24 hours in advance. Menu is subject to change without notice. Bread and milk offered with all meals.

Gather Bible Study "Holy places," is a three-session Bible study by the Rev. Dr. Meghan Johnston Aelabouni

4th Thursday of each month, 12:30 PM in the church library. (3rd Thursday in November) Ladies, join us for a good discussion, fellowship, and maybe some treats! Copies of the study are in the mailbox area.



Physical places often shape our identities, relationships and faith. "Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it," Paul writes. Part of what this means is that faith doesn't just reside in our thoughts or emotions. Faith resides in our whole bodies, and how our bodies "live and move and have our being" in the sacred places where God encounters us. In this Fall 2023 Gather Bible study, written by an ELCA missionary living in Jerusalem, we'll explore what holy places mean, not only for the Holy Land of the Bible, but for each of us, wherever we may be.

September 2023

Holy places: Home

Home can be the place we lay our head and the people we call family. Home can be our community or homeland. Home is also found wherever we truly and fully belong. This month, we consider the complexity and the promise of "home" through the stories of Israel's exile, the ministry of Jesus, and the promises of Revelation.

October 2023

Holy places: Sanctuary

For thousands of years, physical spaces have been set apart for individual prayer and community worship. "Sanctuary" is one word for such spaces. Throughout history, "sanctuary" has also referred to spaces of safety and refuge. If God is everywhere, what is the importance of sanctuary? What can Jesus' teachings and Paul's correspondence with the early church teach us about what sanctuary looks like today?

November 2023

Holy places: Pilgrimage

Pilgrimage, a journey to a sacred place, is a spiritual practice with a long history in Christianity (and many other religions). In the Bible, pilgrimage is not only about the destination, but also about the "holy place" of the journey itself. Considering the journey of the Magi, the walk to Emmaus, and Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem, we'll ponder how pilgrimage can inspire, challenge and transform our faith and our lives.
