

This catechetical focus on the meaning of faith is at the heart of our Lenten journey to the baptismal waters of Easter. #### From the Pastor

"Jesus said to him, Away with you, Satan! For it is written, "Worship the Lord your God and serve only him." Matthew 4:10

The temptation account for the First Sunday of Lent records how Jesus speaks of the purpose of worship. Martin Luther explains The First Commandment—You shall have no other gods. What does this mean? We are to fear, love and trust God above all things.; The Second Commandment—You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the Lord your God. What does this mean? We are to fear and love God, so that we do not curse, swear, practice magic, lie, or deceive using God's name, but instead use that very name in every time of need to call on, pray to, praise, and give thanks to God.; The Third Commandment—Remember the Sabbath Day, and keep it holy. What does this mean? We are to fear and love God, so that we do not despise preaching or God's word, but instead keep that word holy and gladly hear and learn it.

When the assembly gathers for services of worship, the purpose is to live out the command to worship the Lord your God. This purpose is very different from giving in to the temptation of attending to get one's needs met. Jesus did not seek first to get his needs met while being tempted. The true follower participates in the gathered assembly for the stated purpose of worship the Lord God.



#### **Call Process Update**

A revised summary statement for the Ministry Site Profile was submitted on January 6 as follows: Lakeside Community Lutheran Church began on a dock. A mission start organized in 1986 we have a passion for loving God and promoting the gospel message of Jesus Christ by serving our neighbors in need. Many of us are older but we have many resources, many gifts and skills and a great deal of energy that we have poured into multiple ministries to our neighborhood and around the country and world. We seek a pastor who will lead us in faith, care for us and our lakeside community, join with us and support us in our many ministries, as well as help guide the development and implementation of a mission plan designed to engage, educate, and welcome individuals and families in the surrounding community to join our church family.

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in Malawi is one of the fastest growing churches in the Sub-Saharan Africa region. The ELCM was established November 21, 1982. The establishment was done by indigenous lay people who became Lutherans as they worked in the neighboring countries of Zimbabwe, South Africa and Tanzania where Lutheranism had already existed and rooted. In 1999, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Malawi and the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin - ELCA covenanted together in a companion synod relationship.

## Annual Report and Thank You! From Bishop Laurie Skow - Anderson January 2023

Dear Pastors, Deacons, SAMs, lay leaders, members and friends of the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin,

Happy New Year! Did you make a New Year's resolution? I wonder what would happen if entire congregations or even if the whole church council would make a New Year's resolution together. What would it be? What might be a God pleasing, faithful New Year's resolution for you, personally? Your church? Your church council? What is your congregation's New Year's Resolution?

Maybe the New Year's resolution might be to begin every church meeting in the next year by asking a God question like, "I wonder, what does God want us to accomplish in this meeting to-day? How might what we do in our meeting today please God and be faithful to our baptismal promises?" As someone once famously said, "The main thing is to keep the main thing the main thing. The main thing is Jesus." What if our New Year resolution is to repeat that phrase before every meeting?

As a synod, we are good at New Year's resolutions, or at least we always have resolutions at our synod assembly! This year our synod resolution will be to learn more about our indigenous neighbors. Jesus said that the main thing, the greatest commandment was to love God and love our neighbors. On Monday, January 23 we will be learning from our Ho-Chunk neighbors from Black River Falls at our Winter Theological Gathering Rebound: Unsettled History-Hopeful Future at Luther Park in Chetek.

At the synod assembly on April 29 our theme is Rebound: From Worry to Wonder, there will be resolution that will come before the assembly encouraging every congregation to learn about their indigenous neighbors and write their own land acknowledgement and include it on their website and welcome statements in their bulletins. What if your congregation's New Year's Resolution was to learn more about your neighbors and discover new ways to love them?

Our synod's New Year's resolution is to love our neighbors by learning more about our indigenous neighbors and encouraging congregations to write and use land acknowledgements.

#### What is a land acknowledgement?

It is formal statement that a public event is taking place on land originally inhabited by indigenous peoples. (Wikipedia) This statement recognizes and respects Indigenous peoples as the traditional stewards of the land and the relationship that exists between them and their traditional territories. Each of these Nations and Bands is unique and sovereign. We are grateful to their ancestors for their deep commitment to caring for the land.




