#### **Recap of Food Distribution for February**

We had a total of 593 families. Children- 495 Adults- 574 Seniors-489 Grand total of 1558 persons 27369 pounds of food

Below is a letter Lakeside Lutheran Church received from Debbie and Larry O'Connel in regard to their appreciation for Lakeside's generosity.

Friends,

I can't thank you enough for the continued support you give to Yellow Lake Food Distribution both financially and by all the volunteers your church has that come month after month.

Your donation of \$6,620.00 will go towards purchasing food in the coming year. It was wonderful that the Endowment Fund matched your collections during the month of December.

We had a wonderful month in January serving 591 families, even with the freezing weather, a total of 1715 people. We handed out over 25,0009 pound of food. We were able to get both chicken and lunch meat along with cereal, soup, peanut butter and Jelly and tuna and tuna helper. These are all purchased items. Our total for was \$3,597.00, so you see how far your donation will go this year. That is wonderful.

Our year end totals are as follows; Families served, 7,461, a total number of 19,672 people. We handed out 272,952 pounds of food and spent \$37,654.19 for the year.

Thank you again for your interest and dedication in this mission. It is greatly appreciated. You are awesome!!

Debbie and Larry O'Connel Yellow Lake Food Distribution 7615 County Rd U Danbury, WI 54830 Treasurer's Report - 2023 – A year of ongoing change.

Lakeside's financial operations for 2023 started at the annual meeting in October 2022 with the congregation adopting a budget of \$271,247. The payroll portion of the budget was based on a full-time pastor and ten part-time employees. The year proceeded with a part-time interim pastor through the end of July. The year concluded with a part-time administrative interim pastor and a rotation of guest pastors. The retirement of our long tenured office staff created another challenge. We are training new staff and depending heavily on member volunteers to complete many of our operating tasks.

On the financial side, the total receipts fell well short of the adopted budget for 2023. With the changes in pastoral service and reduced part-time employee expense the total expenses for 2023 were also well under the approved budget. With total receipts of \$204,033 and to-tal expenses of \$203,713 the result was a net of \$320.

Within our 2023 expenses of \$203,713 contributions of \$25,438 went to the broader community through benevolence programs. This compares to \$40,009 in benevolence program contributions in 2022. Within the benevolence programs, we send quarterly contributions to the NW Synod of Wisconsin. The 2023 total to the synod was \$11,767 as compared to \$14,919 in 2022.

Lakeside Community Lutheran Church is but one of the 198 congregations in the NW Synod of Wisconsin. The synod has over 73,500 baptized members rooted in the mission of Jesus Christ. The synod budget of \$1.8 million is categorized in five main areas: Church in the world, Local congregational development, Pastors and Deacons, Malawi, and Camps and campus ministry.

Thank you for your ongoing financial and volunteerism support. May our prayers be answered in 2024 with the call of a full-time pastor.
