Blended Worship What's In It for Me?

My wife Lisa LOVES Mel Torme. He is her idol. Back when he walked the earth, she attended every one of his concerts when he was in Chicago. It wasn't enough to attend, she waited for him to emerge from the dressing room door after the concert. She has multiple autographs on books, albums, and random pieces of paper. I'm so glad to have missed that period of her life. She owns every vinyl album (and all of the best of Mel Torme Albums as well). She also loves Jazz and always has the Sirius Station set to Jazz in her car. Ella, Dizzy, Louis, Buddy,..just to name a few.

Now me on the other hand LOVES Rock and Roll, Heavy Metal, and 80's Pop. Journey, Chicago, Guns N Roses, Triumph, Earth Wind and Fire, Kansas, Billy Joel, and Elton John...to name a few. I have very eclectic musical tastes which come from many years as a high school and middle school choir director. Yes, I like Bach, Beethoven, and even the crazy 20th Contemporary Composers.

I hope you're seeing the problem. Road trips are something else...trying to find a genre we can both agree upon is almost as much fun as her using the imaginary passenger brake because of my driving! You might ask where is this going? This month's topic is about blended worship. This is a prevailing philosophy which governs most church's worship planning these days. What it means is that music is selected that fits with the words, emotions and character of worship but is not tied to one specific genre like hymns, spirituals, foot washing gospel songs, alternative (the new name for contemporary praise and worship songs), classical and many others. It also means that every song is accompanied on the instrument that best fits its character. It could be the piano, organ, guitar or even acapella. In addition it might be taking a traditional song and performing it in a completely different style. Some traditional hymns lend themselves well to altering the flavor of their original. Can you imagine A Mighty Fortress is our God performed in a Caribbean Style. It works although I don't think we'll be doing it that way anytime in the near future at Lakeside!

You may have noticed that right now during our worship services at Lakeside, our liturgy is alternative while our hymns are traditional. My hope that everyone finds something they can latch on to which combines Word, Scripture and Song into a relevant and meaningful experience which heightens your awareness of the Triune God in your life. I hope the rich palette of flavors enhances your worship and you find new expressions of our faith which speak to you.

By using this paradigm to plan our worship services, we aim to reach a broad swath of people that both attend on a regular basis but also can attract visitors to join us in our mission and vision of what the church looks like in rural northwest Wisconsin.

Music is a powerful force in the life of the church proclaiming our amazing 2000 year history and traditions. Its deliberate and thoughtful planning aids in proclaiming the Gospel in our community. Through the creative spark and impulse of artists gone before and ones currently writing, they see, hear, experience and touch the face of God.

We continue funding our budgeted operations at a reduced level by using rotating temporary Pastors and reduced office hours as we currently do not have any scheduled office hours for pastoral access. Our current level of monthly receipts have fallen over the past several months and will not support the "Call" of a full-time Pastor.

The stewardship committee formed to renew our 'commitment to generosity' concluded August 31. The valuable information collected during the stewardship drive provided the finance committee and council with parameters for developing the 2025 budget proposal. The proposed budget will be presented and voted on at the annual meeting on October 13.
