Audio Improvements

Some of you may have been noticing that we've been experiencing periodic glitches in our audio system and you may have personally had difficulty in hearing the sermons or readers. Due to these concerns, the Worship and Music Committee has been asked to look into the cost of upgrading our current Audio System in the sanctuary and also look at what is called a 'Loop System', which is very beneficial for hearing aid users. The committee is just beginning the process but we would like as many of you to learn more about the Loop System by going to the following website. <u>www.drssounds.com</u> For those of you who are hearing aid users, an upgrade to your hearing aid might be required by your hearing professional. This is usually a software programming solution. The cost is dependent on your provider and the manufacturer of the hearing aid. Before we would proceed with a Loop System, we would want to survey our member hearing aid users to determine if we should proceed. Stay posted for further updates.

Thank you for the financial support of our ongoing ministry as we continue the call process for a new pastor.

We continue funding our budgeted operations at a reduced level by using rotating temporary "guest pastors" and reduced office hours as we currently do not have any scheduled office hours for pastoral access. Our current level of monthly receipts have been boosted by a few "annual donors" receipts during October. October's offering was \$18,033.

Total receipts for October were \$22,018.

The congregation annual meeting was held after Sunday service on October 13, 2024. The congregation approved the 2025 budget which is a \$10,759 increase over 2024. The 2025 budget continues funding for pastoral services at our current rotating guest pastor format. The 2025 annual budget equates to a monthly average of \$14,800. This budget level provides for our current rotation of "guest pastors" and our Administrative Interim Pastor.

With our stewardship efforts this year, the monthly offering "pledges" will get us closer to the goal of funding the call of a full-time pastor. The monthly receipts will need to average \$21,000 to \$22,000 each month to fund the budget operations with a full-time pastor. In the mean time, budget receipts will be set aside to aid in the eventual funding of a full-time pastor.

Pray for that candidate to come forward!!

This is the first month that the home deliveries for Grantsburg ended. They do not have the volunteers to handle transporting and handing out the boxes, so our numbers were slightly lower, but not that much, I am hoping some of those Grantsburg families made the trip and picked up their own box of food.

We had a total of 592 families, 1687 total people served, and we handed out 29,769 pound of food. Great Job everyone.

Next month our distribution is on the 18 & 19th of December.

I wish each of you and your families a very Happy Thanksgiving, we are truly blessed to be able to reach out to this many families and give them help.

The last couple years we have contacted the schools in Webster, Siren and Spooner to help with any special needs they have. THE GIFT THAT IS YOU! 2024 Christmas Message



As I reflect on my time in Malawi back in early November, I had so many experiences that merit being shared. As I write this letter, perhaps the most important lesson I can offer was that of my new reality as a guest overseas.

Everywhere I turned, I truly felt like I was the most important person present. Yes, there were times where I was the honored guest as a bishop. I was granted the best seats in the church, in the van, on the stage. When I walked the grounds at the Lutheran Compound in my purple clerical, EVERYONE immediately stopped what they were doing to greet me, even if that was their first encounter with me. I was fed better than most and I never had to carry my own luggage. I had women pour water over my hands before

certain meals (including communion) much like Christ did during the Last Supper in washing the disciples' feet. And despite my innermost desires to remind them that I was just another guy, I simply could not insult them in that manner. The way in which they treated me was at the core of their faith practice.

Thankfully, Deacon Laura taught me a valuable insight that helped my understanding more clearly. They didn't treat only bishops that way, they treat all guests that way! Having been to Malawi five times before she took me, Laura has experienced that generous hospitality time and time again. And now that I'm a few weeks removed from their genuine welcome, I still firmly believe that their faith has taught them to love their neighbor and lift them up no matter how far away we may come.

What if we all treated our neighbor as though they are the most important person present at that time? What if we lifted the spirits of the people God places in our lives each and every day? As we prepare for the Christmas story once again this year, we emphasize the gift that comes in the Christ child, God made flesh to live among us mortals. Just think about the lives that the Christ child touched! It started with Mary and Joseph, continued to the shepherds in the fields, and even gave the heavenly host something to praise!

Of course, Jesus went on to touch so many lives - people in need of healing, children in need of welcoming, outcasts in need of community, sinners in need of redeeming. Jesus became the gift who helped them all feel that they were the most important person present at the time, people worthy of his unconditional love, people whose spirits were uplifted.

As we march through the season of Advent toward the birth of God Emmanuel, Jesus the savior of the world, remember the gift of God's presence in your lives. Recognize that God is even present within you and that you are a gift as well! And much like my new friends in Malawi, be that gift for others. Reveal Christ's presence to others through your continued faithfulness and dedication to the God of love because that love can overcome division. You are a gift to this synod and to God's church when you let God's light shine in and through you! May this Christmas also reveal to you the light of Christ through others.
