
Community Quilters



I want to thank each of you for another wonderful year, without all of you this distribution would not happen, so pat yourself on the back for a job well done. Our year end totals are as follows: 7,253 boxes of food handed out to 20,214 people, we received 296,710 pounds of food this year and spent \$47,745.77.

Acts 10-11: Peter and Cornelius



November 30, 2024 Treasurer's Report

Thank you for the financial support of our ongoing ministry as we continue the call process for a new pastor.

We continue funding our budgeted operations at a reduced level by using rotating temporary "guest pastors" and reduced office hours as we currently do not have any scheduled office hours for pastoral access.

Total receipts through November 30 exceed the total expenses by \$62,724.

At the December 18 council meeting, \$30,000 of the available receipts have been designated to assist with compensation expense in 2025 to "call" a new pastor. Good news is coming as the call committee has a candidate to present to the congregation. More details are in the Council Corner of this newsletter.

The congregation annual meeting was held after Sunday service on October 13, 2024. The congregation approved the 2025 budget which is a \$10,759 increase over 2024. The 2025 budget continues funding for pastoral services at our current rotating guest pastor format. At the time we "call" a pastor, we will need to approve a budget amendment to provide for the salary and benefits offered to the pastoral candidate.

The 2025 annual budget equates to a monthly average of \$14,800. This budget level provides for our current rotation of "guest pastors" and our Administrative Interim Pastor. The monthly average will need to increase to \$19,500 with the projected terms of a part time pastoral candidate.

The "calling" of a new part-time pastor for Lakeside Community Lutheran Church

The Call Committee has recommended, by "unanimous consent", a candidate for a part-time (".5") pastor at the December 18, 2024 council meeting. A half-time pastor position is consistent with Lakeside's current financial situation. The Call Committee and Council are guided by the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin ELCA process for extending the call.

The role of Council is to prepare an appropriate compensation package, maintain communication with the synod office, and establish the date, time and place for a special Congregational Meeting and membership vote. Consistent with the LCLC constitution, notification of the special meeting will be made on two consecutive Sundays prior to the meeting.

At the special Congregational Meeting it will be the Call Committee that will share why they were led to make the recommendation and the strengths/gifts the candidate offers to the ministry of LCLC. Guided by the Holy Spirit and following synod guidelines, the Call Committee and Council are committed to a transparent process with frequent and open communication with LCLC membership. Listed below are opportunities for LCLC members to engage in the process.

- An announcement will be made during the December 22nd church service that a "call" for a new Pastor is being made. A brief biography of the candidate will also be presented.
- An introductory letter/biography of the candidate is included in this newsletter and will also be sent to membership via email.
- A notification of the January 19, 2025 special Congregational Meeting will be made during the January 5th and January 12th church services.
- The Call Committee will host a Q & A forum following the January 5th service in the fellowship hall to answer questions about the candidate and the call process.
- The November 24, 2024 video recording of the candidate serving as pulpit supply is available on the LCLC website (lakesidelutheranwi.com) under the "sermons" tab.
- The special Congregational Meeting to vote to affirm the candidate is January 19, 2025 following the church service.
- Members can also contact any member of the Call Committee to get additional information about the candidate.

Call Committee Update

December 18, 2024

Dear Congregation of Lakeside Community Lutheran Church,

We, your Call Committee of Lakeside Community Lutheran Church, are spiritually led to introduce Pastor Peter Johnson to our congregation to meet our needs in these challenging times. After 2-1/2 years of patiently waiting for the call of a permanent pastor, we feel blessed and fortunate to have found a gifted leader who is seeking a part-time position.

Pastor Peter grew up in Grantsburg, WI where he met his wife, Heidi. They have three amazing and spirited children: Jakobe (8), Thunder (7), and Charlotte (6) all who have medical complexities. These children are blessed to have Peter and Heidi as their loving parents.

A graduate from Luther Seminary with a Master's Degree in Divinity and 8 years' experience in ELCA calls, Peter served the Chicken Coop Church in Grantsburg, WI; St. Andrew Lutheran in East Bethel, MN; Oakland-Moscow Parish, (a 2 point parish in Albert Lea, MN); and most recently Moscow Lutheran Church in Moscow, MN. He is currently on a leave from call.

We would like to share the following quotes from the Rostered Ministry Profile submitted to the Northwest Wisconsin Synod of the ELCA by Peter Johnson:

"Preaching and leading worship is my strongest ministry gift, grounded and made possible in my relationship with God as Parent. I trust the Spirit, moving in and around us, and the Word incarnate in the sacraments to bring forth the meaningfulness of our ritual and the authenticity in our transformation of hearts."

"Offering pastoral care and visitation is one of the greatest blessings afforded to me in ministry. I'm gifted in the ability to connect deeply with and relate to a wide spectrum of folks seeking and needing pastoral care and visits. Whether it is in the uncertain times of the intensive care unit of a hospital, the quiet space of a nursing home, a person's own home and sanctuary, on the street bench, or in my office, the presence of God's love is felt, and God's infinite grace is offered."

"In thankfulness, with confidence in God and sporting a pink Mohawk, I humbly guide and empower all to share the gospel of Jesus Christ, holding our hands together as the church, lifting up our hands in praise, and reaching out our hands to serve for the sake of the world."

Finally, in a letter to Lakeside after our time shared with Pastor Peter:

"In the holy and sacred moments of my meetings with your call committee, we listened intently, prayed fervently, and discerned faithfully. Please know that should I be graced with the opportunity to be your next pastor, I will consider it a privilege to stand on the shoulders of the pastors and lay leaders that have come before me, to collaboratively lead us into a future of renewed traditions and new ministries, through our collective hands and feet and the inspiration and breath of the Holy Spirit."

Our committee welcomes questions and conversations about Peter Johnson. We feel we have a tremendous opportunity to lift up the Spirit by bringing Pastor Peter and his family to Lakeside.
