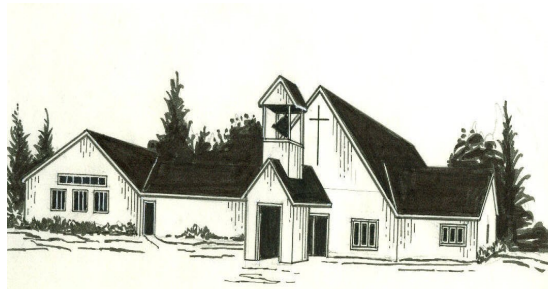

A Letter to Lakeside

Dear Lakeside Family,

As someone who grew up within the walls of Lakeside and has been part of this church family for over 15 years, it's hard to put into words the gratitude I feel when I look around and see the people who shaped my faith, my life, and my calling.

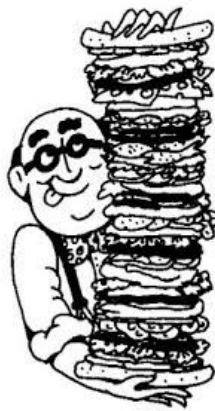
Moving Day August 1st

After 15 months as the Interim Administrative Pastor at Lakeside Community Lutheran Church, we said thank you on Sunday, May 25. Pastor Mary Albing has been an integral part of the growth and energy now seen at Lakeside. Thank you Mary for sharing your many talents and gifts with the congregation!

Pat Barnett, Lakeside Community Lutheran Church Music Director, was honored on June 22 for the leadership he provided to the congregation during the past year. His ringtone, The Wreck of the Edmund Fitzgerald, is his favorite song. He was presented with a picture of the S.S. Arthur M Anderson, the last ship to talk to the Fitz and the first one on the scene to search after the storm.

Mission Quilting is flourishing right now with many new faces and many quilts already finished. We should easily reach our goal of 250 by October this year. World Relief has delivered over 60,000 quilts in the United States this year to storm areas.

We have beautiful baby/youth quilts made by Joan White. Some have matching pillows. They are in the fellowship hall and can be purchased at any time. Make checks out to WELCA and write quilts on the check. Place check in the locked box by the cards.

We use donated blankets and mattress pads for fillers when we get them. Otherwise we purchase rolls of batting for our quilts and that is our most expensive part. The sale of these quilts helps us purchase more batting.



Remember we have totes hanging in the fellowship hall filled with fabric and thread for you to take and make a quilt top. So for those rainy or too hot days this summer, here is a great project.

It is a new beginning with the Call of Pastor Peter! The Council is in the process of developing a strategy and framework for continuing the goals of Stewardship and Outreach. A Communication Committee has been created with “New Beginnings” in mind and a desire to have all the talents of worship streaming, social media, newsletter, bulletin, annual report, and photography under one committee working together to support the goals and needs of Lakeside.

The committee has quickly identified many opportunities and channels to better communicate Lakeside’s mission and ministries. It was determined that developing a reimagined annual report would be an initial priority and a subcommittee has been established to support that initiative.

It is anticipated that the annual report can evolve from the all-text, black & white format for budget reports, statistical information and committee reports, to a colorful outreach tool. Several specific ideas were discussed including expanding the content; adding photography; and developing a “branding kit” as a digital repository for preferred color schemes, font styles, logos, etc.

The committee will be working to have the new annual report available prior the next annual meeting in early October.

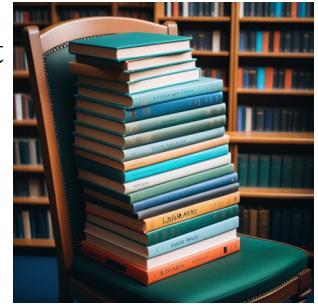
June Mission of the Month

The budget amendment passed along with the “call” of pastor Johnson at the special congregational meeting held in January increased the monthly average operating expenses to \$18,100. The increase provides for the terms of our part time pastor who started on April 1st.

The receipts in May included a \$30,000.00 gift to the Endowment Fund. The gift was deposited into the Endowment Fund investment account and is not available for church operations.
