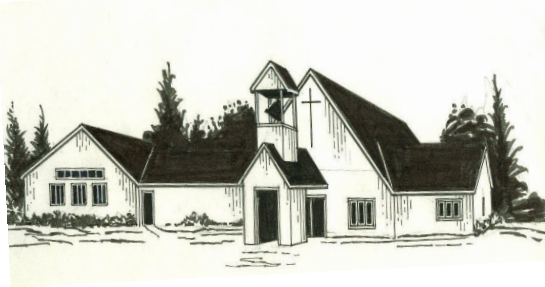

Please join me on this journey beginning Sunday, September 7th. You never know, we just might entertain an angel or two along the way!

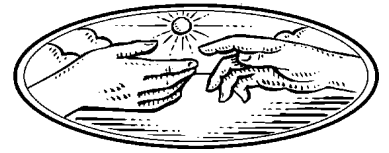

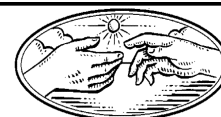

We spent \$4913.11 on cereal, soup, peas, mixed fruit, diced tomatoes, pasta sauce, chicken pouches, mayonnaise, Au Gratin potatoes, and mac & cheese.

We had a total of 619 families.

Adults - 665

Seniors- 487

Grand total of 1821 people

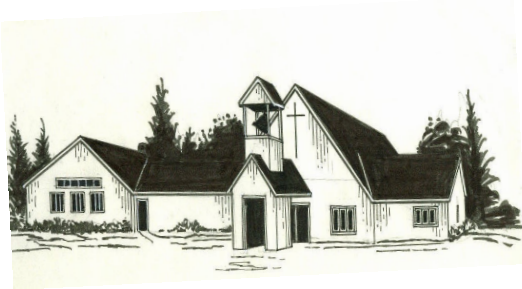
27,231 pounds of food handed out

Thanks again everyone and enjoy the rest of summer.

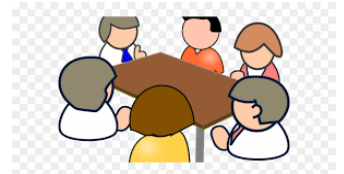

With the different disasters in our own country this past year over 60,000 quilts have been delivered to three southern states. Nice to know we have helped here in the USA and also overseas.

Council Corner September 2025

The Council and Pastor Peter continue to oversee the annual goals through our committee structure and to vision for the future of Lakeside Community through our monthly meetings on the 2nd Tuesday. We welcome your questions and ideas.

Vacation Bible School was once again a success and the Council would like to thank Laurie Lundeen, Jill Schroeder, and Juli Skillman for serving as enthusiastic teachers, Evie Moore and Sheila Treise for leading the creative crafts, Linda Dobson for overseeing the meal, assuring that the children were nourished and for all the volunteers and Pastor Peter who supported this initiative. We are grateful to Kayla Chastek for the enthusiasm and planning she gave to VBS. With her resignation following VBS, she leaves a void presently with our Youth Ministry program. The Council has approved a contract to partner with Luther Park to provide the Sunday School Program for 2025-26 which will begin in October. Registration forms are located in the Narthex.

With this edition of the newsletter, we say goodbye to Kristy DuBois who will be away from Lakeside for the coming year. We are grateful to Kristy and Lois Haag for the years they have served as editors to keep our Congregation informed and thank Julie Swan for stepping in to continue our outreach through the newsletter.

As you see when you enter the Church, work continues to update our surroundings and will continue over the coming years as funds allow. The library project is almost completed with furniture arrival in the next few months. The Council has approved the formation of an Ad Hoc group within the Finance Committee focusing on an in-depth analysis of the capital assets/equipment within the Church in order to plan for the critical financial needs Lakeside faces in maintaining a church that is close to 40 years old. The Council has received the proposal to upgrade our Sanctuary sound system, and it is currently being reviewed by several people to ensure that improvements meet our current and future needs. This project will be addressed by the Council as a priority for 2026.

Our annual meeting is October 12 following the worship service. The Council will review the proposed 2026 budget at our September meeting, and we thank Daryl Sulander for the many hours he spends on financial planning and budget preparation. The Communications Committee is working on the preparation of the annual report with a focus on photos that will tell our story. The Church Photo Directory project continues to be addressed by Council as participation has been only about 50% and we hoped for a much larger group. If you did not have your photo taken and would like to be included, please email to julie@lakesidewebster.org and we will schedule time for you.
