## Council Corner

We begin 2026 with a look behind to a year of God's faithfulness at work among us. In January we called Peter Johnson to be our Pastor and in April welcomed him, Heidi, Jakobe, Thunder Luke, and Charlotte. During May we welcomed the return of the snowbirds, recognized our new members, celebrated our second annual Reconnect dinner, and on June 1, we celebrated the formal installation of our Pastor.

Throughout the summer, with the addition of Julie Swan as interim Office Administrator and support from congregational volunteers, systems were updated, modified or changed with the goal of building a cost efficient, effective, and results-based foundation that would support the Congregational goals going forward. Our goal in 2026 is to be in a position to hire a permanent, part-time office administrator.

The goal of creating a physical environment that was welcoming and nurturing began with the beautiful update to our Library. During 2026, the focus will continue as we look at the feasibility of updating our signage to digital and ways to enhance the entry and narthex of our church.

During 2025 a new Communications Committee was created to support the goal of Outreach. Their amazing commitment culminated with a new Church logo and tag line, an expansion of our annual report to tell our story, a video for our annual meeting highlighting the mission of our church, an update to our website, and expansion of our newsletter. We were challenged to update and publish our Church Directory during 2025 and this will be an achievable goal for 2026!

The partnership with Luther Park Danbury is building our Sunday School program with a focus on supporting our youth and their families as they grow in their faith. Their involvement in Sunday worship culminated with a children's worship service in December and continues our goal of expanding our Youth Ministry outreach.

The resignation of our Music Director challenged the Worship and Music Committee who lost no time in stepping up to continue the commitment to music as an integral part of our worship service. Our congregation is grateful for the music they provided during Advent, Children's Christmas Program, and Christmas Eve Service. We will continue our goal during 2026 to enhance our worship service music and improve the sound system within our sanctuary.

During 2025 our Treasurer Daryl Sulander and Financial Secretary Pat Sulander stepped down from their respective responsibilities and our congregation is grateful for the gifts of their time and talents they have shared over the years. Dave Swan, as Council VP, stepped in on an interim basis to provide financial oversight to the Council and Finance Committee. Our goal in 2026 is to meet the congregational commitment of increasing our giving by 15% and to continue to plan for the future capital needs of a church building that is almost 40 years old.

This past year has brought both joys and challenges, and through it all we have seen God's faithfulness at work among us. Whether through worship, fellowship, outreach, or quiet acts of kindness, our congregation has shown what it means to live out our faith in love and community. Each contribution—seen and unseen—has strengthened our church and reflected Christ's presence among us.

As we look ahead to the coming year, let us do so with renewed hope and trust, seeking God's will and remaining open to where the Spirit leads. May the new year be one of deepened faith and unity and may we continue to grow together in grace, serve with joyful hearts, and be a light to those around us.

## MISSION QUILTING

What a great year we had in Mission Quilting. Since we shipped our 342 quilts to World Relief in October we have continued on to prepare for 2026. We have almost 100 quilts already packed for next year. We also delivered a gift of a quilt to each of the 15 boys that remained at Northwest Passage for Christmas.

Remember that you can donate any sheets, mattress pads, or blankets to help keep our costs down and allows us to keep making these loving quilts to help those in crisis. Also, any of you that haven't left to warmer climates can help us make quilt tops. We have a great group tying quilts on Tuesdays that we need to keep supplied. The green tote bags in the fellowship hall have thread and fabric. Nothing elaborate, just functional.

Check out the chart in the fellowship hall that shows where the quilts were delivered this year. From the 315,818 quilts donated, World Relief shipped 114,000 around the US to help with disasters.

## YELLOW LAKE FOOD DISTRIBUTION



Thank you everyone that helped this month with food. Everything went great - even with it being a little crazy. We had a lot of volunteers both days. That was awesome!

We handed out 596 boxes of food totaling 21,861 pounds, and helped 1,718 people. I don't have the exact amount of our invoice, but it was around \$6,700. I spent more this month because we received a donation to purchase meat, so I spent about \$1,600 on hamburger. The food pantry in Centuria gave us bread which was almost enough for everyone to get some sort of bread item.

The items purchased were cereal, 2 kinds of soup, applesauce, corn, salad dressing, boxed potatoes, egg noodles, rice, corn muffins and the hamburger.

Our distribution in January is on Thursday, January 15th and the set up is the day before on the 14th. It is one of those funny months again with the set up on the second Wednesday and the distribution the 3rd Thursday!

Larry and I would like to wish each of you a very Merry Christmas and Happy New Year. Stay well.

In the past year we have helped with rent, utilities, car repairs, clothing, and groceries to name a few. The local school districts were helped with items that were not covered in their budgets. Our Thanksgiving baskets were a big help to 100 families to make sure they had a full Thanksgiving dinner.

On Tuesday November 25, 2025 we had all the groceries for the Thanksgiving Baskets delivered to the Webster High School. We can't thank the Webster National Honor Society enough for all the work they did to fill the 100 boxes with food. They were there at 9 am to haul all the food into the school and fill the boxes. Our total expense was \$3,516.15. Surprisingly, this was over \$100 less than last year.

Once again, thank you for your support. Amazingly we were able to help with approximately \$14,922.59 to support our community.

### GATHER BIBLE STUDY

**Thursday, January 29, 12:30 PM (CST) (note date change)**

We will meet together in the Library or via Zoom. Please contact Brenda Wheeler if you wish to have the Zoom link sent to your computer or phone. Studies are available in the mailbox area of the church, or online at Women of the ELCA.

### Winter Bible Studies: “Embodied prayer” by the Rev. Liv Larson Andrews

Prayer is an important part of our relationship with God, and one of the ways we respond to God speaking in our lives. At the same time, we may carry all kinds of baggage or heavy questions about prayer: Am I doing it “right?” Do I pray enough? Is prayer always done with words? This two-part Bible study looks to Scripture as a guide to explore some different ways we can pray with our bodies—and with the body of the earth.

#### (January) Session One: Praying with our bodies

Looking to the Apostle Paul, Mary, the Psalms and more, we’ll learn about and try three embodied practices of prayer based on breathing techniques, the use of beads (such as the rosary) and praying in different postures (sitting, standing and kneeling).

#### (February) Session Two: Praying with the body of the earth

Scripture inspires us to regard the natural world as both sacred space and our neighbor. This session explores ways we can pray not only for creation but with creation as our sacred neighbors. As we pray, even the trees and rivers are our prayer partners. The session concludes with the glorious vision in Revelation 22 of a restored world and the river of life.
