PONDERINGS WITH PASTOR PETER

Luke 6:27;31:

²⁷“But I say to you who are listening:...³¹Do to others as you would have them do to you.”

Dear Lakeside Beloved's,

It may not come as a surprise that I was quite the squirelly kid. I was always craving movement and the ability to express creativity. In my early years, I lived to build refrigerator box forts. (My mother not so graciously but always quietly allowed me to ruin her serrated steak knives to cut the cardboard.) As those early years wore on, those fridge box forts evolved into elaborate mini-living quarters with the addition of different rooms built from other sized boxes. As I grew older, these child-sized living quarters inspired me to build detailed housing complexes in our barn for my menagerie of farm animals.

Looking back at my childhood, there were a couple of constants that accompanied all of my creative endeavors. One constant would be the continued affirmation from my folks on the fine craftsmanship and attention to detail that I gave to the design, build, and ultimately the loving care I took of all my animals; the other – my inability to sit still and focus in school which at times was perceived as bad behavior. However, for some reason, when my incessant need for movement and creative expression was labeled bad behavior, my dad would just say, “yep, he hears well, he just don’t listen worth a darn.” (For the record, if my behavior at school wasn’t because of my incessant need for movement and creative expression, I was assured to receive 2X at home of whatever was dished out at school.) Reflecting on those parts of my childhood, I can see that Mom & Dad were hearing the concerns of the school and listening intently to their son; granting me the room to express creativity and the space to love.

When I hear Jesus commanding attention from his hearers, I envision Jesus teaching in hope;

teaching the importance of listening and hoping for all to see a better way. His way. There are no simple answers to the questions of our world or the mystery of the kin-dom to come. Neither is there an easy response to the teachings of Jesus, especially when facing division, judgment through perception, discrepancy in just distribution of resources, and inflamed socio-political ties. How then, might we as listeners of the gospel, seek unity, assess rather than judge, share each other’s resources for the betterment of all in the community, and extinguish the flaming pursuit of rightness for the righteous quest of solidarity? One tangible way is acknowledging that each of us are in need of each other and our neighbor, each other’s and our neighbors gifts, and God’s grace.

Therefore, standing on the shoulders of the saints that have gone before us and by the generosity of the endowment fund made possible through contributions both past and present, we as Lakeside Community Lutheran Church, partner with the Yellow Lake Food Distribution to do to others as we would have them do to us; seek unity, assess rather than judge, share each other’s resources for the betterment of all in the community, and extinguish the flaming pursuit of rightness for the righteous quest of solidarity.

How might we listen and respond to the teachings of Jesus and the call of the Holy Spirit in other tangible ways?

Thankofferings can be received anytime throughout the year, but traditionally, most are received in the fall of the year.

The Thankoffering tradition goes back to the 1800's or even earlier. Then, when it seemed there was not enough money to carry out the work of the church, the women would take action by setting aside offerings at home throughout the year, in thanksgiving for blessings received. The women would come together as we do today, joining their offerings together to support ministry of many kinds. When Women of the ELCA was formed in 1988, a commitment was made to continue this tradition of giving in gratitude for blessings.

Thankofferings are given to support the life-changing ministries of Women of the ELCA (printed materials, website, grants, scholarships, leadership training, support of congregations and synodical women's organizations, justice, and advocacy work). The Thankofferings received are sent entirely to Women of the ELCA.

On October 16th we served a total of 604 families, a total of 1,737 people. 19,454 pounds of food was distributed.

\$5,321.03 was spent on cereal, soup, mac & cheese, diced tomatoes, egg noodles, beans, muffins, pancake mix, syrup and hamburger.

We were totally out of food, cleaned up, and gone by 10 am. That is amazing!

What a wonderful month with lots of volunteers, new and old. I always say, "the more the better!"

The next distribution is on November 19 & 20.

Mission Quilting

What an amazing year! We shipped 342 quilts and 44 dress kits on October 11th. Our total shipping cost was \$1,036.80. Some churches ship their quilts, but are not able to pay the shipping costs. We have always covered our expenses and this year no exception. The September Mission of the Month collected \$886 and JoAnn Warner got a \$250 Thrivent grant which totals \$1,136! Thank you once again for your generosity.

We can't thank you enough for all the help received to move the boxes up from the basement; the Friday crew loading the trailer that VanPykeren's let us use; and then Marsha and Pete hauling the trailer to Rice Lake. We pray God blesses all of you each day.
